

LAKEVIEW CEMETERY IN BLOOM

Lake View Cemetery has over 200 acres planted with shade trees and other ornamental plants. One of the great attributes of Lake View is that many plants display a character rarely seen because most landscapes don't provide the long-term care needed to nurture them to the mature age seen in many of our specimens. Cemetery maps are available from the website or from the office located near the Euclid Avenue gate. The time designations used below correspond to the following: Early month is from the 1st to the 10th, Mid-month is from the 11th to the 20th and Late month begins on the 21st. Plants are listed in their approximate order of bloom. Please remember that Mother Nature is the one in charge and a late spring can delay bloom times by as much as two or more weeks.

You can enter the cemetery from either Euclid Avenue near CWRU or Mayfield Road just above Little Italy.
