

The Plant Exchange will no longer be accepting non-native, invasive plant species. The following is a short list of those species:

Japanese Barberry - *Berberis thunbergii*
Burning bush - *Euonymus alatus*
Oriental bittersweet - *Celastrus orbiculatus*
Japanese Honeysuckle - *Lonicera japonica*
Norway Maple – *Acer platanoides*
Porcelain berry – *Ampelopsis brevipedunculata*
Multiflora Rose – *Rosa multiflora*
European Wintercreeper – *Euonymus fortunei*
Bethlehem bells – *Ornithogalum umbellatum*
Crown vetch – *Coronilla varia*
Cypress spurge – *Euphorbia cyparissias*
Yellow flag iris – *Iris pseudacorus*
English Ivy – *Hedera helix*
Japanese Knotweed – *Polygonum cuspidatum*
Daylily – *Hemerocallis fulva*
Purple loosestrife – *Lythrum salicaria*
Mugwort – *Artemisia vulgaris*
Common Mullein – *Verbascum thapsus*
Myrtle – *Vinca minor*
Pachysandra – *Pachysandra terminalis*
Snowflake - *Leucojum aestivum*
Snow-on-the-Mountain – *Aegopodium podagraria*
Sweet woodruff – *Galium odoratum*

In addition, do not bring diseased or insect infested plants to the plant exchange, they will not be accepted. Scale, aphids, black spot, etc. Take a moment to look your plants over before bringing them to the plant exchange.

Do not bring any plants in bags except for bulbs. Plants need to be potted securely beforehand so that they are stable in the pot.

Plants without a label will not be accepted. Label should include name of the plant, including genus, species, cultivar name, season of bloom, height, color and any other pertinent information, and don't forget to include your name.
